

REPORT ON STORY TELLING

“The purpose of a storyteller is not to tell us how to think but to give us questions to think upon.”

Story telling is one of the most effective ways to communicate with students. A story stays with the children much longer than facts or statistics as it is not a seemingly endless download of information but a never-ending journey of learning and understanding of the world around us.

To foster the skills of listening and reading, a storytelling session by Ms. Sonia Duggal, a popular storyteller and a self-taught puppeteer, was organised by Scholastic Pvt.
