The next stopover was at the India Gate. The students listened curiously as they were informed about the importance of this war memorial that was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens. After a scrumptious lunch at Bikanerwala, the students visited the historically rich Teen Murti Bhawan. Nehru, his contribution to the freedom struggle and his ideals and dreams for the country. Children were inspired as they caught a glimpse into his life.

At the Rail Museum, children observed the different engines and carriages on display. They admired Fairy Queen, the world's oldest working steam locomotive still in operation. They were also astonished to see a fascinating and exotic collection of over hundred real size exhibits of Indian Railways.
