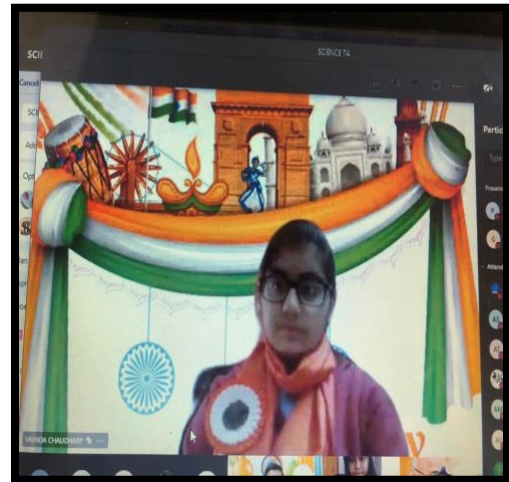
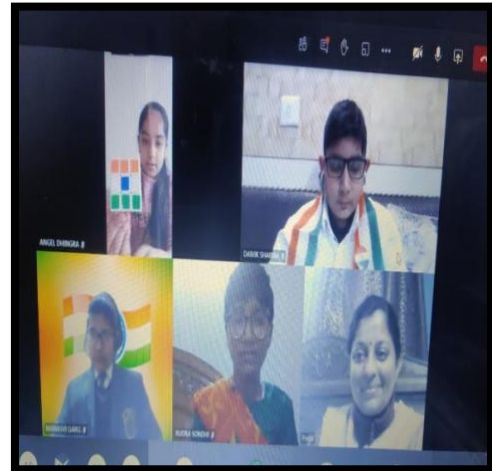


Report - Republic Day Assembly (Middle School)
