DHAROHAR CLUB TRIP 2025

On April 5, 2025, an educational trip was organised for Class X members of the Dharohar Club to Humayun's Tomb, Sunder Nursery, and the Sunken Museum. It was a guided tour and was led by Mr. Aashish Mathur, a professional, and a passionate heritage walk guide.

The journey began with a visit to Humayun's Tomb, where students explored the grandeur of Mughal architecture. The experience extended beyond textbook knowledge, offering an immersive understanding of India's architectural legacy and the visionaries behind it. History came alive through intricate structures, lush gardens, and stories embedded in stone.

The students then explored the newly constructed Sunken Museum, innovatively built into a traditional stepwell (Baoli). Through ceramic models, short documentaries, and the soulful sounds of qawwalis, they engaged with Delhi's layered cultural past. Oral narratives and interactive exhibits provided insights into the lives of the people who once walked these streets, including references to poets like Kabir, thus connecting history with language, art, and philosophy.

The final leg of the tour took students to Sunder Nursery — a heritage park that beautifully combines ecological awareness with historical appreciation. Here, they learned about indigenous plants, sustainable gardening practices, and the importance of conserving biodiversity. This segment emphasised the link between heritage and environmental responsibility.

In just six hours, students experienced a vivid glimpse of a bygone Delhi — a city where nature thrived, empires flourished, and timeless art was born. The trip served as a powerful reminder of the city's enduring cultural and historical identity, while inspiring students to value both their heritage and environment.
