

Report on Educational Visit to National Museum, Janpath, New Delhi

An educational visit to the National Museum, Janpath, New Delhi, was organised by Delhi Public School, Gurgaon, Sector-45, on Saturday, 5th April 2025, for the History students of Class XII A and XII B. The visit was conducted as a part of the school's initiative to promote experiential learning beyond classroom boundaries.
