


The purpose of the interaction was to increase awareness on issues regarding animal welfare and protection.

At the onset, Dr. Ganjwala,gave a very impressive presentation on animal care and protection. This was very informative and inspiring. The students interacted with the resource person. She gave expert guidance and counseling to the eager children and they benefited immensely from this meeting. She stressed on the need to make an informed choice prior to keeping pets. One must be physically and emotionally prepared to take care of the pets and must be fully conversant with their behavioural patterns. Pets must never be left alone or abandoned no matter what may be the reason. She emphasized on the need to amend anti poaching laws so as to make them more stringent and make them an effective deterrence against this inhumane act. She asked the students to adopt pets from shelter homes, as these Indian breeds are the most resilient and adaptable. They are very faithful and make excellent watch dogs.

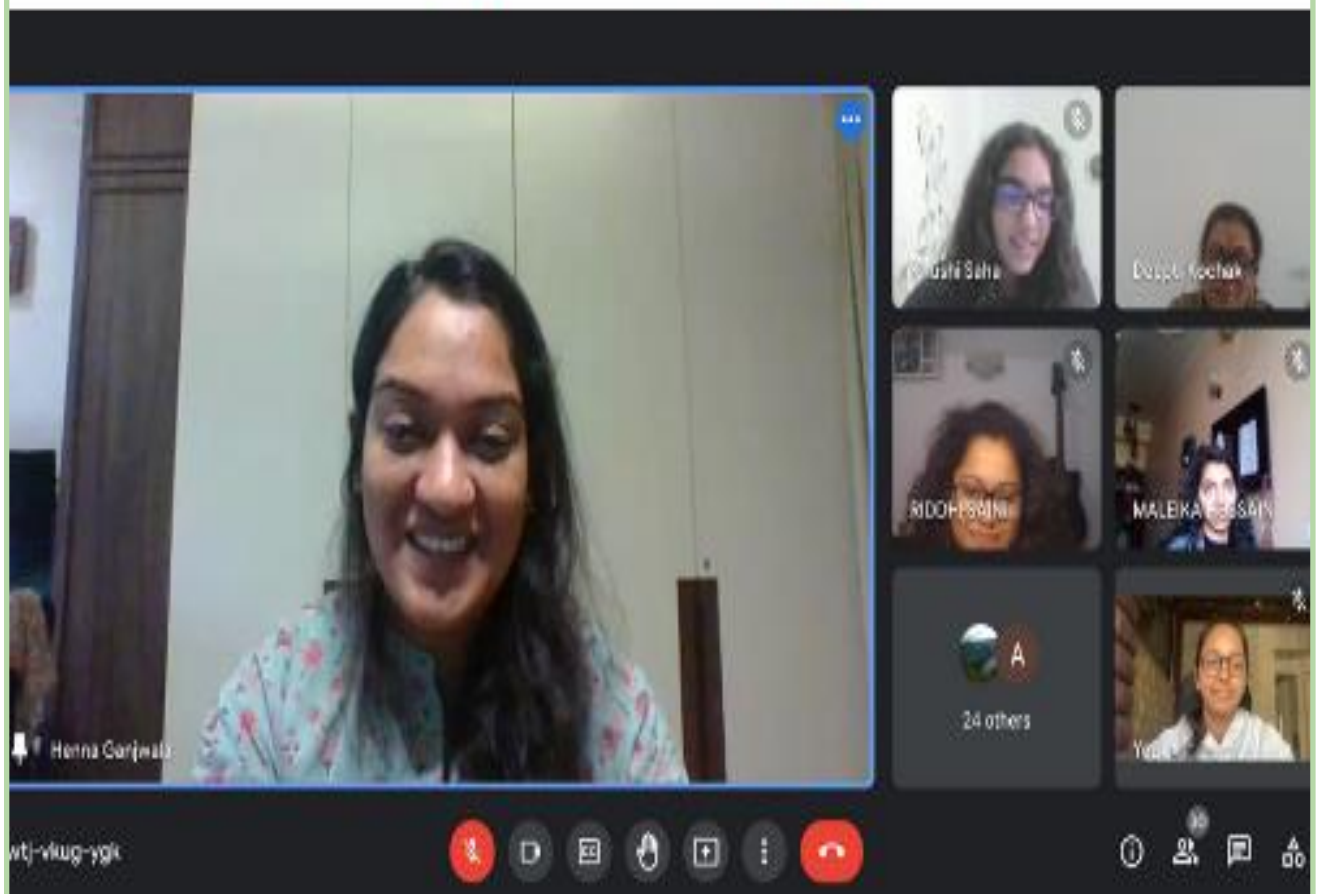
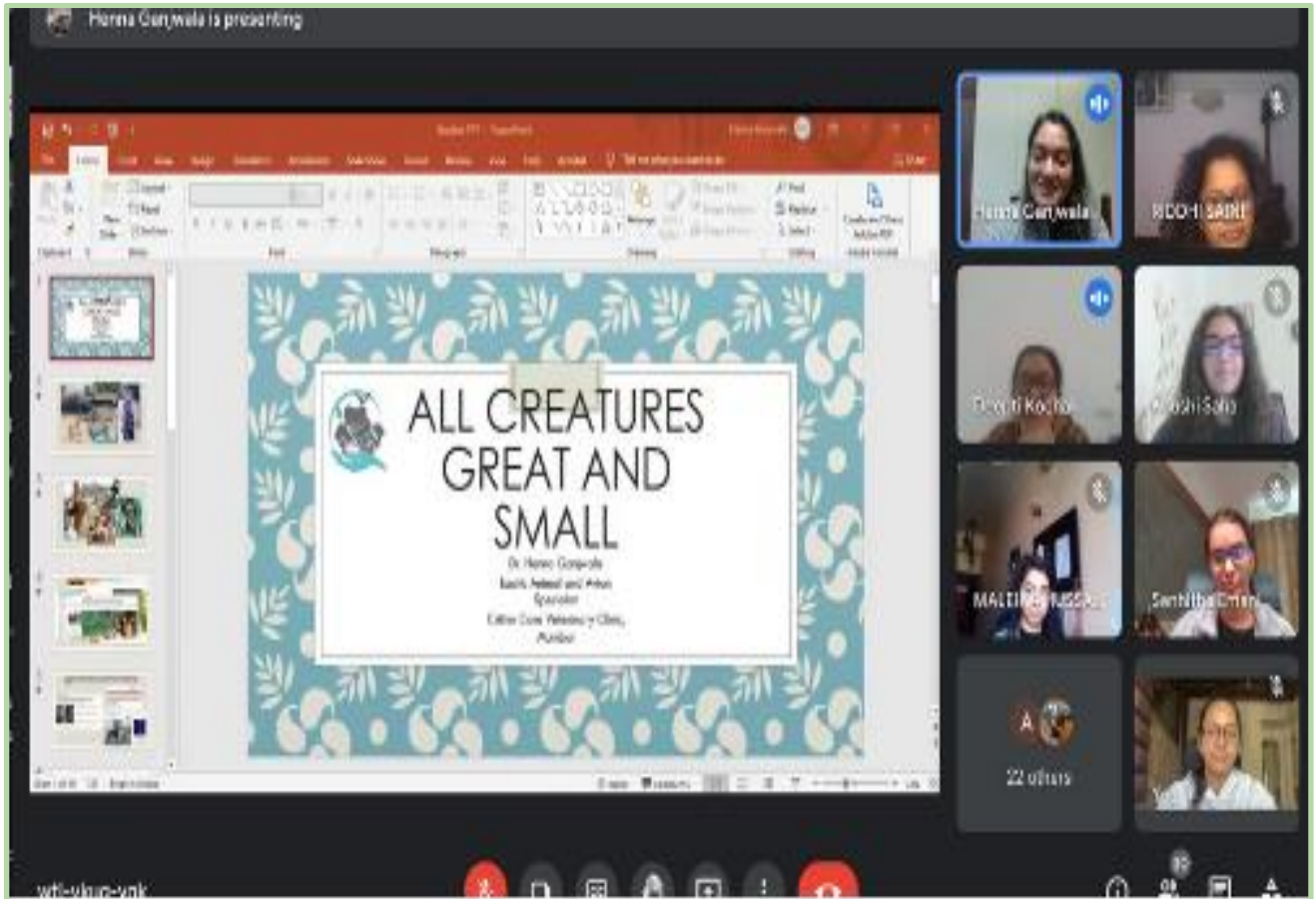


