Social Science, in its broadest sense, is the study of society and the way people behave and influence the world around us. It tells us about the world beyond our immediate experience, and can help explain how our own society works. With an aim to instil the feeling of national pride and patriotism in the children, the Social Science Day was observed from October 4th to 8th October 2021 across classes III, IV and V. A myriad of activities were conducted to create awareness amongst the students about the Swadeshi- Make in India products, Indian sports personalities and the unsung heroes of India.

Students of class III were acquainted with the ‘Make in India’ initiative- a major national programme of the Government of India designed to facilitate investment, foster innovation, enhance skill development, protect intellectual property and improve manufacturing infrastructure in the country.
